## Information released:

Your request was on behalf of your respective organisations, to view the other bids submitted in your area. For this, we have assumed the bids for the 'Licence to Deliver Investors in People in England 2011-2014'.

By 'respective organisations' we have assumed the unsuccessful joint application of ANE and TAN and by 'other bids submitted for our areas' we have assumed IDG Ltd, the successful bid for the North West, Yorkshire and Humber and the North East; and EMB Ltd, the successful bid for the West Midlands, East Midlands and the East of England.

I can confirm that the UK Commission for Employment and Skills does hold this information however it is exempt from releasing under the Act due to exemptions 41(1) and 43(2) being engaged.

## Exemption 41(1) – Information provided in confidence.

Information is exempt information if it was obtained by the public authority from any other person (including another public authority and, the disclosure of the information to the public (otherwise that under this Act) by the public authority holding it would constitute a breach of confidence actionable by that or any other person.

The reasons that this exemption is engaged is due to:

- Information contained within tenders is provided to us in confidence;
- We do not have permissions from third parties (tender submitters) to release their information.

## Exemption 43(2) – Commercial Interests.

Information is exempt information if its disclosure under this Act would, or would be likely to, prejudice the commercial interests of any person (including the pubic authority holding it). NB – A person may be an individual, a company, or any other legal entity.

The reasons that this exemption is engaged is due to:

• The commercial sensitivity of information contained within the tender documents which relates to a person's ability to participate actively and competitively regarding:



- Financial information relating to the company/organization, which is not currently in the public domain, is contained within the document;
- Current business information, which is not in the public domain, is contained within the document;
- Business forecasts, which are not in the public domain, are contained within the document; and
- Business plans, which are not in the public domain, are detailed within the document.
- In all circumstances of the case, the public interest in maintaining the exemption outweighs the public interest in disclosing the information as release of the information is likely to prejudice the commercial interests of any person. NB A person may be an individual, a company, or any other legal entity.
